During the Academic year 2017-2018 we received £6435.00 based on 4 Looked after Children who qualified for the funding.

Student 1

This year 11 student has had one to one tuition to support her English, Maths and Science exam entries this year, revision books have also been purchased to support her through the exam period. A Laptop with full security and software packages has also been purchased to support the student needs. Due to the very complex needs of this student a lot of one to one work with staff has been carried out in preparation for her to move onto college and therefore some of the funding has been used to support travel costs for this purpose. Over the year this student has also been on a number of educational trips and some social trips to encourage her to mix and to experience different surrounding with a view to encouraging her to be more independent and build self confidence.

Student 2

This year 9 students funding has been used to support his need to build confident, interact with others of all ages and to be involved in the care of animals and to take some responsibility for their wellbeing, with this in mind this student has been provided with a selection of horse riding equipment and individual and private riding lessons across the year. This has built the students confident and allowed him to become more independent.

Student 3

This year 9 student has very poor attendance and before joining our school did not attend school at all. His progress rose to 38% however when he did attend school it was usually for the last hour and he wouldn't interact with either staff or students. It was decided that progress in English and maths was not being achieved but through various professional meeting it was decided that a one to one tutor service delivered to his home address would be more beneficial to the student, Therefore the funding has been used to support this across the year.

The Senco and School Leader are in contact with the provider and have progress information to support the spend.

Student 4

This year 10 student was only with us for half a term before being moved back out of the area. The funding was not made available at the time, and therefore not spent.

£935.00 remains unspent.

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
